Front of coin

Rough Water: Represents the struggle that we must all learn to navigate.

Boat: Represents the vehicle warriors used in their journey into battle. Once the warrior landed ashore, they destroyed their boats. Their mindset was that the only way to get back home was to defeat the enemy and take their boats.

Axe: The common tool used by Viking warriors to build homes and protect their families, but in battle one swing would create the mindset of invincibility for defeating the enemy.

Heart: The heart inside of the axe represents your why, your purpose and the courage it takes to complete the mission.

Handle: The red handle represents the blood and sacrifice from those of the past who fought for our freedom. As a tribute to them are the words "We Did" down the side of the handle.

S.I.T: See It Through- Going from point A to Z and not letting life's circumstances and distractions get in the way.

See It Through: Words of affirmation and inspiration.

Axes: Symbols of strength and courage

Respect-Educate-Encourage-Perseverance are the four principles of this program. We say see it through and R.E.E.P. the benefits.

Clinched Hands: Represents the bond and comradery that developed through adversity and victory.
